- *Day 1 April 29th*

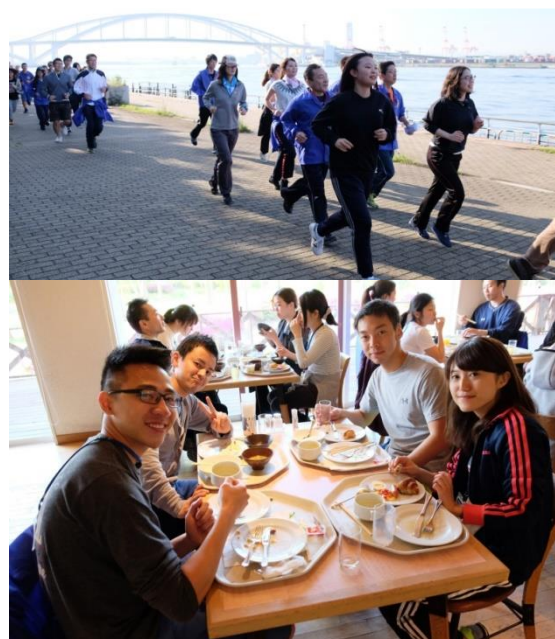
